

# Voucher scheme for Long Lasting Insecticidal Net (LLIN) distribution in Tanzania

## *Who did the programme involve?*

## *What were the key elements for success?*



The National Voucher Scheme in Tanzania is a public-private partnership with the objective of increasing access to, and the use of, Long Lasting Insecticidal Nets (LLINs) by pregnant women and young children.

Women are given a discount voucher during appointments at reproductive and child health facilities, which can then be exchanged for an Insecticide-treated bed net (ITN) or LLIN at participating retail outlets at greatly reduced price.
